Independent Schools

Independent Schools are required to Obtain a Schools Animal Use Licence from the Scientific Licensing Unit of the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD)

Common activities that REOUIRE approval

- Chicken egg hatching
- Monitoring and caring for very voung or vulnerable animals (e.g. 1 day old chicks)
- Breeding small mammals (e.g. mice. guinea pigs and rabbits)

The Animal Welfare Act 2002 applies and schools are responsible for the safety and wellbeing of the animals

Ongoing care

Consider procedures to:

- Ensure appropriate food and clean water is available at all times
- · Roster duties such as cleaning housing
- Manage health care (e.g. vaccinations)
- · Arrange weekend and holiday care
- Ensure security from predators and vandals
- · Keep animal care and use records

Reporting is compulsory

- **Activity Completion Report**
- Annual Report via the online Animal Ethics system by the end of November



Reporting is optional

• Schools may submit an Annual Report via the online Animal Ethics system



Common activities that DO NOT require approval

 Any live animals not used in teaching science (e.g. goldfish tank in the office)



- Laying hens housed in a coop
- Companion or therapy animals
- Class Pets (eg goldfish, budgie, guinea pig)
- Activities using invertebrates (eg insects, spiders, worms, snails, crustaceans)
- Observation of tadpoles transforming into frogs as long as they are returned to their original environment
